

Tishman Construction celebrates installation of One World Trade Center spire; Worked with Port authority of N.Y. and N.J. to place 408-foot spire

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On May 10th, Tishman Construction, an AECOM company, worked with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey to install the final two sections of One World Trade Center's 408-ft. spire. Now bolted in place, the spire brings One World Trade Center's height to a symbolic 1,776 ft., making it the tallest building in the Western Hemisphere. In addition to being an architectural feature, the 758-ton spire is also functional - serving as a beacon for Lower Manhattan and a broadcast facility that will provide transmission services for the region's broadcasters.

"Having built the World Trade Center's original Twin Towers, our company has a strong connection to this site," said Dan Tishman, chairman of Tishman Construction and vice chairman of AECOM. "All of us at Tishman are incredibly proud of this historic achievement."

Jay Badame, Tishman's president and COO for New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, said, "The installation of One World Trade Center's final section of spire steel is a crowning triumph for everyone involved in the site's rebuilding."

"Friday's extraordinary milestone of One World Trade Center reaching 1,776 ft. would not have been possible without the tireless efforts of the workers from Tishman Construction," said Port Authority executive director Pat Foye.
