"We are pleased to celebrate the topping out of 228 West 80th St. and to embark on the next phase of construction, as scheduled, with initial occupancy less than a year away," said Amy Rose, co-president of Rose Associates. There will also be a bowling alley, golf simulator, half basketball court, and a full gym with a yoga studio.
