Despite percieved division, this past election has shown that Long Islanders are generally together on the need for infrastructure and transportation funding, affordable housing, and mixed-use/transit-oriented development. In 2019, we will we see a stronger push by communities for planning decisions and funding to be controlled by local municipalities that are familiar with their specific hopes and challenges. Additionally, projects where the developer works with local communities have a higher number of approvals in a shorter timeframe. I believe we will see more developers following this trend rather than leaving the community out as we have seen in the past.

What was an unexpected event that occurred in 2018, and how did it impact your career or personal life?

This year I, once again, was presented with the opportunity to move off of Long Island. After giving it serious thought, I came to the realization that there really is no place I would rather live than right here on Long Island. Despite its challenges, Long Island is a great place to live and raise a family.
