After a time in flux, our local economy is improving and our county finances are stronger. We're developing responsible budgets, working to grow our county fund balance, and our 2019 budget included a tax cut for the first time in 14 years. Over the past eight years, the unemployment rate has been cut in half, but we still have work to do. There are 4,000 open jobs and I am committed to working with our partners to get those filled. Our workforce director Sara Liu is working hard to get people hired. We have expanded our Opportunity Impact Program, a partnership with SUNY Broome and several of our local companies. After a six-week training program, you are guaranteed a job. Our Clean Sweep program is getting Broome County residents who are on welfare back into the workforce. Additionally, thanks to the Greater Binghamton Chamber of Commerce, we have our Welcome Wagon program, which helps extend a warm invitation to those considering taking jobs here in Broome County.

We live in a great community and are doing everything possible to make it even better. We're making it better for our veterans, too, with a one stop shop for veterans' services. We are putting all veterans' programs and services under one roof at the former Vestal Hills Country Club in Binghamton. Our veterans deserve to have a facility that shows we care, a place they feel comfortable, welcomed, safe and taken care of. This will be it. It will be a model for communities around New York State and be the gold standard on how a community should take care of its veterans. The plan is to have this new facility open in late 2020.

There is nothing greater than getting out into our communities and meeting with our residents. Together each and every day we're making Broome County a great place for our families to live. We're home to April the Giraffe, have a booming craft beer industry and you can't forget about our delicious spiedies. Our "Go All Out Broome" program provides a simple guide to the hundreds of places and thousands of acres for you to explore in Broome County.
