The New York Palace is one of the largest hotels in the area to operate using 100% renewable energy, offsetting 22 metric tons of carbon dioxide annually, as well as following best management practices to operate the hotel efficiently. Energy efficiency measures include variable speed drives on HVAC equipment, high efficiency lighting, and conducting regular performance audits.

She is highly motivated and takes action that will benefit the hotel's bottom line with thoughtful environmental solutions.
