Turbo Contracting Corp. team members and OceanSafe executives conducted tours of the construction project at 1887 Deer Park Ave., highlighting the installation of OceanSafe's revolutionary, lightweight durable and green building system. This is one of the first times on Long Island that OceanSafe's Structural Steel Insulating Panel System (SSIP) is being used to build the exterior envelope, walls and roof of a commercial structure.
