



PWC continuing ed offers waterproofing and green roofs instruction; Event sponsored and presented by SOPREMA and PCGNY

On January 16, Professional Women in Construction (PWC) presented two programs in their newly launched Continuing Education program: "Waterproofing" and "Green Roofs." Topics are AIA/HSW-approved and participants earned one Learning Unit (LU) per class. This was PWC's second program in the series.
