Gran is a Fellow of the American Institute of Architects, has served on the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission, and has been a design critic at Pratt Institute. He holds a Bachelor of Architecture from Penn State University and studied planning at Pratt Institute. He has owned his own firm, Warren Gran & Associates, and has been a partner at Gran Sultan Architects as well.
