

N.Y. establishes outstanding tax credit program for taxpayers that remediate/develop contaminated sites

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Brownfield tax incentives are critical tools to Brownfield cleanups and redevelopment because taxes incentives encourage cleanup Brownfield sites by allowing taxpayers to reduce their taxable income by the cost of eligible site cleanup expenses. Through such favorable tax treatment of cleanup costs, the incentive program aims to encourage Brownfield site redevelopment.

A taxpayer who cleans up a contaminated site and has entered into a Brownfield Clean-up Agreement (BCA) with the NYSDEC is eligible for NYS tax credits related to the clean-up and/or re-development costs.

Once a Certificate of Completion (COC) is obtained, the taxpayer is eligible for a tax credit of up to 50% dependent upon the level of remediation, location and type of taxpayer (personal or corporate).

The Brownfield Tax credits include: Site Preparation Costs: Covers remediation, demolition, excavation, fencing and security, wiring, scaffolding, and other capital account costs, to make the site usable for commercial, industrial, residential, etc.

Qualified Tangible Property Costs: Covers costs of buildings and improvements that are placed into service within 10 years after the CoC is issued.

Onsite Groundwater Remediation Costs: Covers costs that are incurred to implement a "remediation work plan" under the BCA.
