

Scarangello of Thornton Tomasetti elected chair of New York Building Congress

Thomas Scarangello, a structural engineer, has been elected chairman of the N.Y. Building Congress, succeeding AECOM chairman and CEO John Dionisio. Scarangello was installed as chairman during the Building Congress' annual membership meeting, held on Jan. 13th.

Scarangello is chairman and CEO of Thornton Tomasetti. Throughout his 30-year career, all at Thornton Tomasetti, he has been involved in the structural engineering of a wide variety of building types worldwide, from long-span sports and entertainment arenas and stadiums - such as the new Yankee Stadium and the Barclays Center - to high-rise commercial and mixed-use buildings.
