Fast Fashion Continues. H&M's concepts & Other Stories and COS have both made very successful debuts, and Topshop's second store in the city continues to draw lines around the block. Marshalls also continues to expand, offering great values. Shoppers today combine apparel of all prices points, so the more the merrier!
