This portfolio of qualifying experience must be submitted before taking the comprehensive exam. Another key component is professional affiliation. One must have proof of CCIM Institute membership in good standing and be a member in good standing of the National Association of Realtors. Lastly, one must pass the comprehensive exam. This exam is only given once each year, each time at a different location around the world. The exam is 2-3 days long and includes a course concepts review (CCR) and a comprehensive exam. Designees must score 70% or higher to pass the exam.

Whether its access to an extensive network of professionals around the globe or the results and expertise you bring to your clients, the benefits of being a CCIM are diverse and plentiful. Having a CCIM designation is the most prestigious designation commercial real estate professionals can achieve within the industry. For clients, by partnering with a CCIM, they effectively utilize the

top-level, most reliable performers in the industry. Working with a CCIM ensures minimal risk, structured credibility, informed decision making, and the ability to close more deals. As far as community and network, there are CCIMs in every state and across the globe in over 30 countries. The network of CCIMs expands from large metro areas to small cities and towns.
