So it's safe to say that you are indeed renting their services. Speaking of projects, if you are planning swing space construction, it would make sense to consider renting office furniture

Upon completion of this section of the building they were able to relocate all departments, and to continue their expansion plans by hiring more new employees. This is in fact another twist on the concept of swing space.
