What recent project or transaction are you most proud of?

We represented a religious organization selling a stone church that was beautiful but in serious disrepair and no longer had a congregation. While we were in contract to sell to a developer, a neighborhood group petitioned the Landmark Preservation Commission (LPC) to evaluate the structure. We took a proactive approach with the commission by presenting an analysis of the steps initially taken to sell to another church, detailing landmarked buildings that were under the stewardship of this organization, and the prohibitive costs to repair the building. The LPC ultimately did not proceed with a landmark review and the building was sold.
