



Congress Building and Consigli complete \$60 million, 110,000 s/f skilled nursing and rehabilitation project

White Plains, NY Congress Building Corp., a full-service construction firm based in Peabody, MA, collaborating in a joint venture with Consigli Construction, has completed construction of The White Plains Institute for Rehabilitation and Healthcare, a \$60 million, rehabilitation and skilled nursing community. The new premier 110,000 s/f, five-story community features modern amenities including two full gyms/rehabs, one solely dedicated to its short term rehab residents, activity programs, full 24-hour care and a specially designed Dementia/Memory Care Living neighborhood. Other amenities include underground parking, community spaces on each floor, full service barber/beauty salon, and multiple dining facilities with outdoor urban dining, roof-top terraces and lounges designed to connect its residents to the downtown urban environment offered by this location.

Developed by The Congress Companies, the facility is owned by White Plains Health Care Properties of Peabody, MA, and designed by The Architectural Team of Chelsea, MA. The facility will be operated by Epic Healthcare, one of New York's Westchester County leading providers of rehabilitative and skilled nursing residences and services.
