

AIA New York names 2020 Design Award recipients

New York, NY A jury of independent architects, educators, critics, and planners convened at the Center for Architecture to select the winners of the 2020 AIA New York Design Awards. The jurors publicly named the 35 winning projects at a symposium at the Center for Architecture on January 13th.

The 35 selected projects and the architecture firms that designed them–represent the exceptional work by AIA New York members and architects practicing in teh city in five categories: Architecture, Interiors, Projects, and Urban Design, and Sustainability. The jury also selected one project–Glenstone by Thomas Phifer and Partners–as "Best in Competition."

All winning work will be exhibited in the 2020 AIANY Design Awards exhibition at the Center for Architecture beginning Thursday, April 16th, with an opening reception from 6:00-8:00 p.m. The exhibition, designed by Omnivore, will remain on view through June 27th.

In addition to the exhibition, winning projects will be recognized at the Honors and Awards Luncheon, Friday, April 17th, at Cipriani Wall Street.
