



Suffolk County IDA gives preliminary approval to InvaGen Pharmaceuticals

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Hauppauge, NY The Suffolk County Industrial Development Agency (SCIDA) has preliminarily approved a transaction to assist InvaGen Pharmaceuticals, Inc. in leasing, renovating and equipping an existing 69,654 s/f building at Old Willets Path. The \$2.7 million transaction will be essential in helping the pharmaceutical manufacturer remain competitive and retain hundreds of local jobs through turbulent economic conditions caused by the pandemic.
