Crystal products are installed in many notable buildings throughout the New York metro area and in over 40 states nationwide. Thomas Chen and the Crystal Windows success story have been featured on numerous business TV shows and in many leading business and industry publications including Wall Street Week, Crain's New York Business, Fortune Magazine, Inc. Magazine, and The New York Times.

In addition to his business prowess, Chen is also recognized in New York for his charitable work and his devotion to educational and art initiatives. He has contributed tirelessly to many Queens and New York area non-profits and art institutions and has been honored by the Queens Museum, the Queensborough Community College Art Gallery, and the Flushing Council on Culture and the Arts.
