

The Catskill Project's passive house development receives two Certificates of Occupancy

The homes are part of TCP's collection of climate-friendly houses that blend carbon-neutrality and Passive House design with modern day comforts. A "Certificate of Occupancy" is a permit, issued by the local municipality, ensuring a property complies with all relevant building codes and is safe for occupancy.

Each of the four home designs have been created to satisfy the diverse needs and requirements of buyers' different lifestyles. Capturing the essence of the Catskills region, the four home styles – Balsam, Overlook, Tremper and Red Hill - range from 1,783 up to 2,283 s/f, offering configurations of two to three bedrooms with two to three and a half baths. Custom options, including a

garage/carport, a three-season room, and a guest suite/artist studio provide residents the opportunity to personalize their homes to their preferences.

The Catskill Project homes bring residents a blend of tranquility and convenience. From farm-to-table restaurants to craft breweries, boutique shopping and art galleries, residents can indulge in the local culture while enjoying the serenity of their surroundings. Residents can also partake in top-tier outdoor recreation activities such as hiking, birding, trout fishing and nearby skiing, some of which can be done on-site across the remaining 40 acres of stunning woodlands and untouched nature preserve available to members of the community.

Designed and built in accordance with passive house principles, each of the four model homes guarantees exceptional energy efficiency, optimal comfort, and a reduced environmental footprint. Starting at \$995,000, owners can choose from lots sized from 3 to 6 acres. The integration of sustainable features ensures a consistent, comfortable temperature throughout all seasons while minimizing energy consumption. All four TCP homes will form a high-end collection of climate-friendly, Passive House designed homes dispersed across 90 acres of breathtaking landscape, creating a carbon-neutral community in the Catskills.

TCP homes offer residents modern day conveniences and socially conscious designs that integrate into the region's natural beauty, with lush forests, cascading streams, and stunning waterfalls all available for the exclusive use of the residents. The Catskill Project provides a safe, healthy, comfortable retreat where TCP homeowners can gather with friends and family.
