



Project Hospitality and The Hudson Companies open Castleton Supportive Housing development

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Staten Island, NY Project Hospitality and The Hudson Companies commenced the ribbon-cutting of Castleton Supportive Housing, a 48-unit affordable housing development in the Port Richmond neighborhood on the north shore. Financing was provided through the New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) Supportive Housing Loan Program, Low-Income Housing Tax Credits from HPD syndicated by Richman Housing Resources, construction debt from JP Morgan Chase, and permanent financing from Merchants Bank.

Located at 1546 Castleton Ave. in Port Richmond, the six-story building consists of 31 permanent supportive homes, 16 affordable homes for households earning 60% of the area median income,

and one unit for the building super. Project Hospitality, a non-profit provider for the homeless, will operate a ground-floor community center and provide residents with on-site supportive services, including employment assistance, educational opportunities, and physical and emotional benefits.

Castleton Supportive Housing will offer amenities to its residents, including an on-site resident manager, a shared laundry room, a resident lounge with outdoor space, a fitness room, bike storage, and a ground-floor community center.
