Stern Architects (RAMSA)-designed residential development located at 100 Claremont Ave. in the city's Morningside Heights neighborhood. Within the historic Union Theological Seminary campus and developed by Lendlease and Daiwa House Texas Inc., Claremont Hall offers 165 condominium residences with views of the Hudson River and the New York City skyline.

The unit also has landscaped outdoor space including a loggia - a hallmark of the RAMSA tower design.
